SUBJECT: Project Clarity and Macatawa Greenway funding requests

Outdoor Discovery Network is requesting support for their Project Clarity and Macatawa Greenway efforts.

The requests for Project Clarity and Macatawa Greenway are again \$50,000 and \$13,000, respectively. This is the tenth and final installment of a ten-year commitment to Project Clarity. The \$13,000 for Greenway efforts has been in place since 2011. Project Clarity has a dedicated budget line item while the greenway services falls under the budget allocation for contracted services.

Recommendation

To approve the \$50,000 request for Project Clarity and refer the \$13,000 request for Macatawa Greenway to the contract for services committee for review.

On behalf of the ODC Network, I'd like to thank Holland Charter Township for partnering with us in the important work to clean, restore and maintain the waters of Lake Macatawa and the Macatawa Watershed. We are in the process of finalizing our watershed's management plan, which helps guide future initiatives and helps our community stay competitive for state and federal grants. It has taken a good deal of effort to update and include our past decadesworth of projects and activities, which should position us well for gaining future funds. We have also undertaken a feasibility study to evaluate further engineered solutions for phosphorus removal from area waterways.




2024 Annual Report

Project Clarity is a community-wide partnership that works to improve the health and clarity of Lake Macatwa and its watershed. Since 2012, we have realized significant improvements in water quality, including a 60% reduction in the amount of phosphorus in the lake. Our work in 2024 focused primarily on updating the Macatawa Watershed Management Plan, project planning and outreach and education.

Watershed Management Plan

The purpose of a watershed management plan is to guide water quality restoration and protection actions. The existing plan was approved in 2012, so it was due for an update. Updating includes evaluating existing data and past implementation actions, conducting various field inventories, completing priority areas modeling, and gathering public input. An EGLE grant is helping to fund this work. A draft plan will be submitted to the EGLE by the end of March 2025. The plan will be available for public comment and the ODC welcomes your input.



Phosphorus Removal Study

In early 2024, ODC solicited proposals for an engineered solution for phosphorus removal. Several local experts helped review proposals and select the team of Fleis & Vandenbrink and Environmental Research and Design, Inc. They will evaluate the feasibility of implementing an engineered solution to help remove additional phosphorus from the Macatawa River. The study will be completed over the next nine months. If the solution is determined to be feasible, we will include it as part of our continued comprehensive watershed restoration in the coming years.

Outreach and Education

- Hosted 2 Explore the Mission Tours to showcase Project Clarity and Macatawa River Greenway restoration projects
- 24 community partners helped to make the Macatawa Water Festival a success!
- Completed 40 rainscaping site assessments
- Completed 50 road stream crossing inventories



We had two amazing interns this summer to help with field inventories, management plan writing, and other events.

Project Clarity Phase III Progress Report | January 10, 2025



In early 2024, ODC solicited proposals for an engineered solution for phosphorus removal. Through this process, we hired the team of Fleis and Vandenbrink (F&V) and Environmental Research and Design, Inc (ERD) to conduct a study to investigate possible options that may work for the Macatawa Watershed. A contract was signed with F&V in September 2024. The following work has been completed since the contract was signed:

- Held a kickoff meeting on November 4 with the study team and ODC staff to review project roles and responsibilities, a communication plan, project elements, project schedule, and take a tour of the watershed
- F&V reviewed existing data and studies
- F&V starting collecting water samples for lab processing in Early December at 4 locations in the watershed: Macatawa River at 96th Ave, Macatawa River just upstream of the dredge disposal site, Macatawa River at N River Ave, and Pine Creek at Stu Visser Trail
 - First sampling event was on Pine Creek able to reduce total phosphorus from 98 ppb to 19 ppb using 4 mg/L of alum (80% reduction)
 - Sampling of Macatawa River sites is scheduled starting the week of January 13

The Macatawa River Greenway (MRG) consists of a network of permanently protected public and private lands that wind their way along the Macatawa River. The MRG Trail is a paved route across the greenway that connects Laketown and Park Townships all the way to Zeeland Township and beyond. Designed for both local and regional users, it connects our community to local parks as well as the Fred Meijer Kenowa Trail and Bike Route US-35, tying our pathways to Grand Rapids, Grand Haven, Saugatuck, and beyond. Over 24 partners are involved in featuring parks and natural areas designed for wildlife habitat and human recreation.

Middle Macatawa Improvements

ODC Network, in collaboration with Ottawa County Parks and Holland Township, have been a part of design and permitting discussions for trail construction and park improvements along the greenway between the Upper Macatawa Natural Area and Hawthorn Pond Natural Area. Improvements include updates to trails and new bathroom facilities. Construction is anticipated in 2025.

PawPaw Streambank Restoration

ODC was awarded a \$300K grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation for streambank stabilization and restoration along the Macatawa River running through Paw Paw Park. This part of the river is scouring at a rapid rate, threatening wetland restoration and a section of the future greenway trail. This is a two year grant, and the first year of work has consisted of finalizing engineering designs and obtaining permits. In 2025, construction will take place and the grant will wrap up at the end of the year. We can only continue to receive these grants with local matching funds pledged by our greenway partners — thank you for your ongoing support of our work!



In 2024 we hosted 3 cleanup events: over 50 volunteers removed 400 pounds of trash!
